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Challenges Faced:

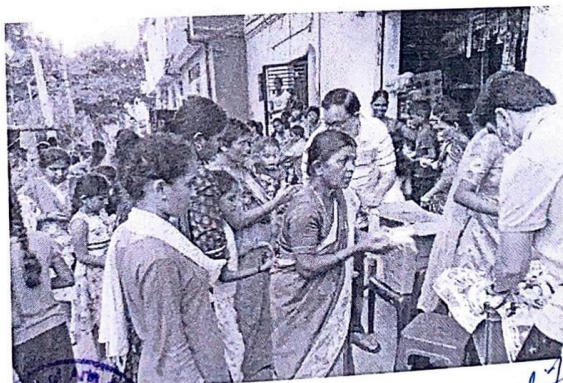
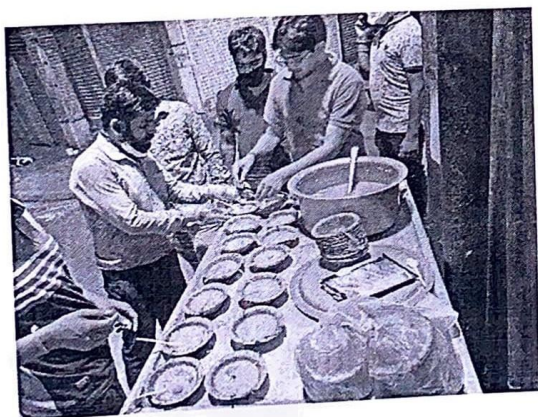
1. **Resource Constraints:** Limited resources such as funding, volunteers, and food supplies posed challenges in scaling up the activity to meet the growing demand.
